This half term with have continued with our theme of Special Stories. We have looked at stories that mean something special to groups of people. We have read the story of Rama and Sita, and learnt about Diwali. We read the beautiful picture book Confetti, which enabled us to talk about weddings, christenings and birthdays. Finally, we have read the Nativity Story, as we have prepared for our Nativity Christmas Songs. The children have learnt the focus words; Celebration, Tradition and Community. Our circle times have focused on similarities and differences between how these events are celebrated. We reached the conclusion that they all have special food, and that they all include some sort of light, be that fireworks or candles.









Roseberry Class

This term year 1 and 2 have made a fabulous start to their phonics, reading, writing and maths. Their handwriting has improved immensely, with daily focus and pure determination.

In writing the children have developed their recall skills, used 'grow the code' for spellings and and increased their pace. Inmaths, everyone is securely using counters, tens frames a rekenrek and numicon. They use them to fully understand numbers, how they are formed and to solve calculations. The children are the best class in school when explaining which jobs use maths skills.

Finally, and most importantly, has been the time, effort and ambition the children put into their Nativity, which I'm sure you will agree was a delight to watch. Learning 10 songs, Makaton sign language and lines seemed like a huge task, but they smashed it out of the park. I am going to miss this spectacular class, each and every one of them make it worth while coming in on those dark, wet and dismal days. I can't wait to hear about their progress not only for the rest of this year, but all the way to year 6.

Year 3/4 SCAFELL

This autumn term has been a wonderful opportunity to get to know the Year 3/4 class and celebrate the enthusiasm they bring to learning each day. In English, we have enjoyed exploring stories such as *Paddington* and *Something Fishy*, which have inspired thoughtful discussions, creative writing, and a growing love of reading. Across the wider curriculum, the children have shown great ambition as they tackled lots of exciting new learning in history and geography, developing their understanding of the world and the people who live in it.

DT lessons have been a real highlight, with the children tasting a range of foods and learning to talk about flavours and preferences respectfully. In RE, we have explored new learning about different religions, encouraging inclusion by exploring and valuing beliefs and traditions that may be different from their own.

It has been a pleasure getting to know such a thoughtful, curious, and ambitious group of children this term, and I am very proud of the progress they have made

Year 5 SNOWDON

What a busy half term this has been! Year 5 have been working so hard throughout it! In reading, we have finished Narnia, which all of the children thoroughly enjoyed! We have then read 'The Island', by Armin Greder. We used this to do some fantastic drama about being washed up on an island, which then inspired our writing. In maths, they have worked at their multiplication and division and are now learning all about fractions. They have also really enjoyed their swimming lessons, where all of them work so hard!

In the afternoons, we have finished our Geography work about the Alps. The children finished the unit by making some beautiful booklets informing people about what they can do in the Alps. In History, we have just finished learning about the Maya. We spent a lot of time looking at the end of the Maya civilisation and how this could have happened. They loved looking at different sources and types of evidence and making claims about this.

Our PSHE has all been centred around Health and Well-being, which has led to some very interesting conversations about how to keep both mentally and physically healthy. In RE, we have been learning about the 5 Pillars of Islam and starting to compare this to other religions. In French, we have been looking at the Solar System, and last week the children created their own planet, and wrote sentences to describe it! A highlight for Year 5, has been their Art with Mr C. They have created some brilliant instillation art and taken fantastic photos to display these.







Year 6 BEN NEVIS Year 6 have shown our school values of ambition, compassion and inclusion in everything they've taken on this term. Their ambitious approach to learning was clear as they immersed themselves in Holes, crafting powerful descriptive writing that conveyed real emotion and creating play scripts that explored the complex power hierarchies at Camp Green Lake. In maths, they demonstrated determination and ambition by strengthening their foundations in the four operations, with improved arithmetic results reflecting their hard work. WAC News - Autumn Term This term we have welcomed back old and new faces to both clubs, this has been great to see as we enjoy seeing you all. Our Breakfast Club starts at 7.30am and we provide them with a breakfast which consists of various cereal, toast, bagels, fresh fruit and yoghurt and from here we then take them into school for 8.40am. We also offer this as a non breakfast club which starts at 8.15am where pupils can play before school starts. Our After School Club runs from 3.15/3.20pm and we have one that runs until 4.20pm and one that runs until 6pm. When the pupils come up to the unit, we provide them with a snack and drink which contains fruit and then for those pupils whom stay on past 4.20pm we provide them with a light snack tea. In September, the unit became known as "Bright Starts", a name that Mr Harrison gave the unit as we also welcomed Giggle & Grow playgroup to join our unit a few times a week and the community cafe once a term. Over the course of this term, our pupils have been using imaginative play-dressing up as superheroes, princesses, astronauts, dinosaurs and more. 
