It is with considerable pleasure that I write to you this term, reflecting on the remarkable achievements and developments that have unfolded across our school. The energy, enthusiasm, and commitment demonstrated by our pupils, staff, and families continue to inspire and strengthen our school community.

This term has been particularly rich in experiences that extend learning beyond the classroom. Our pupils have engaged in the NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe workshops, equipping them with essential knowledge and confidence. We have celebrated World Book Day through our innovative Book Bistro, an event that truly captured the magic of reading and storytelling. Our Key Stage 2 pupils participated in a drama workshop day that brought creativity and expression to life, whilst our Young Voices pupils delivered a spectacular performance at Sheffield Arena—a moment of genuine pride for all involved. Beyond these headline events, our diverse range of clubs—from Science Club to Pop Choir, from Animal Club to Football Club—continue to enrich our provision and nurture individual interests and talents. Our sporting competitions, including cross country, tag rugby, and dodgeball, have showcased the competitive spirit and resilience of our young people.

What has been particularly heartening is witnessing our pupils living our school values in action. Year 5 have demonstrated exceptional compassion through their community litter-picking initiative, whilst simultaneously beginning their Mini Police course—an opportunity that is fostering genuine engagement with our local community and developing their understanding of citizenship. Year 6 have embarked upon an exciting AI maths tutoring programme, which has proven highly effective and will be extended to Year 4 and Year 5 during the summer term. These initiatives represent our commitment to providing innovative, forward-thinking education that prepares our pupils for the future.

I am delighted to report that our attendance continues to improve and now sits slightly above the national average. This achievement reflects your sustained commitment and partnership with us, and we remain grateful for your support in prioritising regular attendance.

Furthermore, we have recently welcomed our Ofsted inspection team. We are immensely proud of the work our school community has demonstrated, and we look forward to sharing the final report with you once received.

Looking ahead to September, we are pleased to announce the expansion of our Early Years provision. We will be welcoming 2-year-olds to our school family, and we continue to have Nursery and Reception places available. Our Early Years provision has consistently supported children to achieve above the national average for over three years, and this trend shows every sign of continuing. We warmly invite you to arrange a visit to experience the exceptional work undertaken in our Early Years. Additionally, we are delighted to confirm that Miss Botherway will continue to teach our Year 3/4 class throughout the summer term.

Nursery – The Hive

This half term in Nursery, we have been exploring our theme 'Funky Food and Moving Muscles', with lots of exciting opportunities to support learning across the EYFS areas.

We have been learning all about keeping our bodies healthy, including how to look after our teeth and make healthy choices. Our focus story, Supertato, has been a firm favourite, with the children thoroughly enjoying his heroic efforts to save the day from the mischievous Evil Pea — who has brought plenty of chaos to the Hive! These experiences have supported the children's Communication and Language, Literacy, and Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

Outdoor play has remained a big focus, with the children developing their gross motor skills through climbing, running, and biking. These activities are helping to build strength, coordination, and confidence (and hopefully encouraging some well-earned rest at home!).

Inside the classroom, the children have enjoyed role play and small world activities linked to Supertato, Oliver's Vegetables, and a range of stories about healthy eating and looking after our bodies. This has supported learning within Expressive Arts and Design and Understanding the World.

We were delighted to welcome parents into Nursery for a "crafternoon" — it was lovely to see so many of you and to share in the creative chaos together! We also enjoyed inviting Giggle and Grow into the Hive for Mother's Day crafts, where it was wonderful to meet some new faces and welcome them into our setting.

To further develop our love of stories, we have enjoyed visits to the library, as well as welcoming the library into Nursery for a special story time.





The Early Years

Reception

This term our theme has been 'Healthy Body, Healthy Mind'. We have read the stories; Veg Patch Party, Kitchen Disco and Bathroom Boogie! As well as our new favourite, Find Your Happy.

We have learnt how to make healthy choices, for our mind and our body. This has included learning about 'tasting the rainbow', by eating something from each colour of the rainbow – everyday! In the classroom we have explored; pineapples, kiwi, mango, pears and blueberries, as well as sugar snap peas, peppers, corn and cucumber.

After days of squashing, cutting, and hammering them- we tasted them. Our children were really surprised to find out what they liked, kiwi and mango were the favourite! Finally, we have learnt to tell the story Jack and the Beanstalk. Our giant voices are amazing! We planted our own magic beans and are currently waiting for them to grow!!



KS1 Year 1 and 2

It has been a very rewarding term for Rosebery Topping, and they have worked incredibly hard, especially while adapting to a new teacher. They have thoroughly enjoyed their class book, *Super Happy Magic Forest*, and have produced some wonderfully creative writing, fully immersing themselves in the story. In maths, the focus has been on addition and subtraction, and they have shown great effort and determination in developing these skills. They continue to work diligently in phonics and are making steady progress.

In geography, we explored whether we would prefer to live in a hot or cold country, with a particular interest in learning about the North and South Poles. In history, the children enjoyed studying the history of toys. In DT, they made healthy wraps, which linked well to our PSHE topic on health and well-being. In science, we explored the five senses and carried out investigations to understand how they help us experience the world around us.

Well done for all the hard work!

YEAR 3 & 4 Scafell

What a busy Spring Term it has been in Year 3/4! The children have worked incredibly hard throughout and should be very proud of all they have achieved.

In reading and writing, we have been exploring *Cool* by Michael Morpurgo, which the children have really enjoyed. We have then used the picture book *The Door* to inspire our writing, where we created a mysterious door in our classroom so the children could experience the story together. This led to some fantastic, imaginative pieces of writing and lots of excitement, with the children showing real ambition in their ideas and vocabulary. In maths, the children have been developing their skills in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, and have also been learning all about perimeter. They have shown great perseverance and determination as they have built their confidence, supporting one another with inclusion and demonstrating compassion.

In the afternoons, we have been very busy across the curriculum. In Geography, we have been looking at the importing and exporting of food, which led to some really interesting discussions about where our food comes from. In History, we have been learning about Ancient Egypt, including the process of mummification — the children especially loved mummifying tomatoes! In DT, we designed and made our own slingshot cars, which the children worked very hard on with ambition and care. In Art, we have been focusing on shading and mixing paints to create different tones, producing some lovely work. In Science, we have been learning about forces and light, and the children have engaged thoughtfully in investigations, showing curiosity and inclusion in their discussions. Our PSHE has been centred around health and wellbeing, which has led to some thoughtful and compassionate conversations about how to keep ourselves healthy. In RE, we have been learning about Jesus and how he has inspired others, making some great links in our discussions and showing respect and compassion towards different beliefs. The children have also really valued their afternoons with Mrs Kennedy and have loved developing their French this term, supporting each other with inclusion and showing ambition in their learning.

It has been a fantastic term, and we are so proud of all the effort, enthusiasm and positive attitudes the children have shown!

Wraparound Care News

This term we have been delighted to welcome new faces to both Breakfast and After School Club as well as our existing pupils.

Reminder that our Breakfast Club is open from 7.30am and After School Club closes at 6pm. We have noticed a slight increase in numbers now that the hours have increased and still have spaces available for both clubs.

For the first half of this term, we have remained inside the unit due to the weather and dark nights. Our pupils have been very good with our creative play by using the tool station and shopping scenes that our friends at Giggle & Grow have kindly let us share. Some of our younger pupils have inspired us with their tea party menu's and this has gone down very well with a lot of pupils inc the adults!

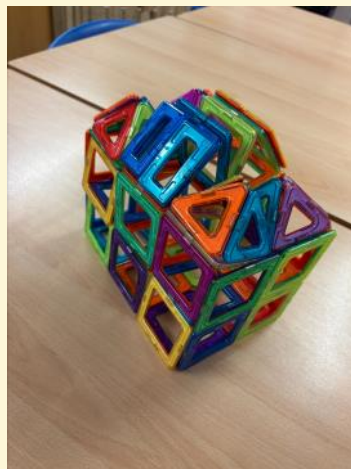

Year 5

Year 5 have had a very busy and exciting term!

In Writing, we have enjoyed reading a new book called '*Varmints*', which explores animals living in the world and the importance of caring for our environment. This has inspired some fantastic pieces of writing, including thoughtful letters to local residents about littering. As part of this, we took part in a litter-picking trip to Millennium Green alongside the Wombles. The children had a brilliant time and showed great teamwork, collecting nearly eight bags of rubbish—an amazing achievement! In Maths, we have been focusing on fractions and decimals. The class have worked incredibly hard and shown great perseverance, especially when tackling more challenging concepts. We are very proud of their positive attitudes and determination.

In PSHE, our topic has been *Safety and the Changing Body*. The children have explored how to keep themselves and others safe in a variety of situations, contributing thoughtfully to discussions. In RE, we have been learning about different religions and their beliefs about death. This has been a particularly engaging topic, with the class demonstrating maturity and respect during some very interesting and meaningful discussions. In History, Mrs Bendelow has been teaching about the Tudors, which has been a very popular topic among the children. Alongside this, the class have also been learning about the oceans and how we can protect them, linking nicely to our environmental focus this term.

Well done, Year 5, for all your hard work and enthusiasm!

Year 6

Year 6 have had a fantastic and productive half term, showing great determination and enthusiasm across all areas of learning. In maths, pupils have explored fractions, decimals and percentages, and are showing great engagement and dedication during our AI tutoring sessions. In English, the class have thoroughly enjoyed studying *Goodnight Mister Tom*, using it as inspiration for a wide range of writing, including heartfelt letters as evacuees, engaging newspaper reports on William's disappearance, and beautifully crafted narratives - which will even be sent to the author.

Across the curriculum, Year 6 have continued to shine, taking part in energetic fitness circuits in PE and exploring the fascinating topic of evolution in science. Throughout all their learning, pupils have truly embodied our school values of ambition, compassion and inclusion, supporting one another and striving to achieve their very best.

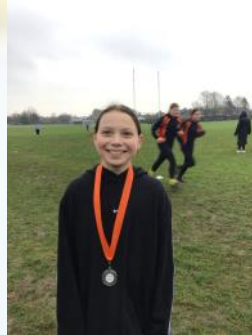
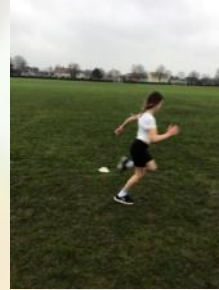

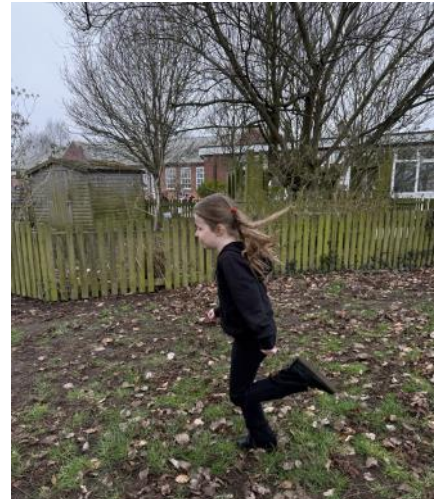
Cross Country Year 3-6, KSI fun run, Dodgeball Year 5&6

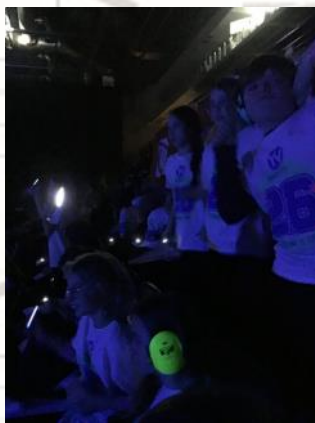


BOOK BISTRO
